
OUTDOOR SERVICE "PEACE LIKE A RIVER"

CHURCH LIBRARY MINISTRY

Leota's Garden by Francine Rivers features eighty-four-old Leota Reinhardt whose garden was once a place of beauty. It had been her refuge from the deep wounds inflicted by a devastating war, her sanctuary where she knelt before a loving God and prayed for her children who couldn't understand her silent sacrifices. All her efforts to reconcile with her adult children have been fruitless, and she voices her despair to a loving Father, her only friend. Then, God brings a wind of change through unlikely means: one, a college student who thinks he has all the answers; the other, the granddaughter Leota never hoped to know.

In Dreams Forgotten by Tracie Peterson is Book 2 of the Golden Gate Secrets series. Judith Gladstone came to San Francisco after her parents died to find her last living relative, an aunt she never knew she had. Instead she has fallen head over heels in love with Caleb Coulter, her friend's brother. Caleb has promised to help Judith find her aunt, but she can tell he thinks of her only as a friend. When Caleb traces Judith's aunt to the wealthy Whitley family, Judith is united with her long-lost relative. However, the truths she learns about her past and her parents are shocking and overwhelming. Finding her family could cost her everything.

Deception by Randy Alcorn is the third book following *Deadline* and *Dominion*. Homicide detective Ollie Chandler has seen it all and done more than he cares to admit. But when he's called to investigate the murder of a Portland State University professor, he finds himself going places he's never gone before. Joined by journalist Clarence Abernathy and their friend Jake Woods, Ollie pushes the investigation forward. Soon all three are drawn deep into corruption and political tensions that threaten to destroy them, along with anyone who tries to help. But they're in too deep to quit. They've got no choice but to follow the evidence to the truth. A gripping story of murder and spiritual struggle.

HEALTH MINISTRY

Do I Need the Shingles Shot? A Health Ministry Check Up By Krista Vanden Brink, RN



In a word, if you are over 50, YES, you do need the shingles shot! I am going to use the trade names as it should be much clearer.

In the past, consumers over the age of 60 were encouraged to seek out their pharmacy to receive a shingles vaccine called Zostravax.

Over the past year, there has been new research and development for a new and improved shingles vaccine called Shingrix. Shingrix is licensed and approved for use in those people over the age of 50. Shingrix is a 2-dose vaccination series and even those of you who already received the single dose of Zostravax, you should contact your pharmacy and sign up to receive the Shingrix vaccine. (The pharmacy can help you determine if there is a co-pay or how much out-of-pocket expense you may have). This vaccine is 90% effective against shingles.

Shingles is a painful rash that develops on one side of the face or body. The rash consists of blisters that typically scab over in 7 to 10 days. The rash usually clears up within 2 to 4 weeks. In other cases, the rash occurs on one side of the face. In rare cases (usually among people with weakened immune systems), the rash may be more widespread and look similar to a chickenpox rash. Shingles can affect the eye and cause loss of vision. Other symptoms of shingles can include: fever, headache, chills, and upset stomach.

Go ahead and make the call. There's no use suffering if you don't need to.

Education - Attendance; Mar First 73 – Second 91; Thanks to Becca for reading names for memory awards at service; Thanks to Jeremy for reading names of graduates at Service; Preschool VBS and K-7th held same week this year went well. 78 children attended. Thanks to Jenn for calling for VBS treats and *Theresa* for calling children not registered. Rally Sunday: Discussed conducting Rally Sunday activities during Sunday School hour. Dunk Tank and Bouncy Castle have been reserved. Activities discussed Face painting, Fishing pond, Ring toss bowling, corn pool sidewalk chalk.

Youth – Finalizing and posting the Youth director position, see handout for description and suggest input; VBS students visited Wellington and the visits were meaningful and fun; Twins game was cross-generational and 38 attended; Houston trip is a go, details finalized; Todd Hove's farewell is being for Sunday, July 22nd.

Stewardship- Discussion centered around researching and choosing a different method of planning for Run Sunday beginning on Oct 7th; decision will be made at July stewardship meeting.

Worship – Outdoor service will be June 24th at Phelps Park, at 9:30, flyers and newspaper ads have been publicized; rain location is DLC; a litany for youth and adults travelling to Houston will be that Sunday during worship; a proposal for engaging kids in worship service has been made to invite students participating in the Wed mornings WILD choir to perform in church. Summer Music * Following dates have been filled for special music: June 17th and 24th, July 8th, August 1st & 5th . ● Several others have stated they will sign up. Encourage to recruit other musicians to sign up. Beth will contact Cooks and Renee will follow up with those who have indicated they will perform but have not signed up. Communion Assistants Instructions * Renee and Pastor Brenda are working on new instructions * Beth will confirm with Pastor Brenda the instructions for Wednesday night communion. * Future volunteers will be contacted regarding the new instructions and possibly holding instructional meeting with these volunteers.

Evangelism- Planning for the new church directories is going as planned. We will have a conference call with the vendor to iron out details and costs. We are exploring two different options for the directories, a smaller and a larger size. We have been working on a new Welcome Brochure for visitors and prospective members that incorporates the new logo. We are planning a new social event for new members to help welcome them to the church. Finally, we are designing a new prayer request card that incorporates contact information and prayer requests. This will likely replace the blue book and the current prayer cards that are located in the pews.

Property & Mgmnt- Pastor Dave and Pastor Brenda attended part of our meeting and told us the Vacation Bible School went very well. Nine organ pipes where replaced and the church bell was inspected for its welds. Our church bell was built in the late 1800's. We received some bids on possible replacement of our church copier but we felt the bidders didn't compare machines and services in a way we wanted so Mary Fitch is going to contact the representatives of these companies to get an apples to apples comparison. We are still wanting more applications for the church office manager position. An urgent need has come to the P & M committee, both air conditioning units in the church and educational wing are not working properly (they are on their last leg) and the furnaces in each building are in very poor condition. These units are twenty years old and we can't get parts for them as they are anymore. Just to keep the air conditioners running is costing the church approximately \$1,000 every month to add freon that is leaking somewhere in the A/C units. That leak can't be located. The P & M committee will go to the council tonight asking for approval that both air conditioning units and both heating units be replaced. The new units are much more efficient units that will, in time, save the church energy and repairs. The cost of these units will be \$19,884 from Vick's Heating and Plumbing. This cost includes all labor.

Pastors' Report- Pastor Dave extended thanks to VBS staff and volunteers; Pastors and members attended the Synod Assembly, thanks to Diane Gossman, Ted Wilson, Cindy Hansmeier; there will be an Executive Committee Retreat on June 16th at 3 PM; Pastor Brenda has started planning for Fall activities.
