From the Pastors

Dear Friends,

March is fast approaching (or already here depending on when you read this) and we are deep within Lent. Each of the Sundays we will hear the covenant stories and on Wednesday nights we will hear about Jonah and his many adventures. During the month we also have the feast for Joseph (March 19) and the Annunciation of Our Lord (March 25). On Wednesday nights we will hear the song from Mary's Annunciation and her song, from Luke 1: 46-55

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever."

The one that we don't celebrate in worship very often is Joseph's feast day. From introduction of the day from Sundays and Seasons:

Father figures abound in the appointed texts for the commemoration of Joseph, the guardian of Jesus. Almighty God promises to be a father to David's offspring. The letter to the Romans celebrates Abraham as "the father of all of us." The angel invites Joseph, son of David, to be like a father to Mary's child Jesus. As we remember Joseph's doing as the angel of the Lord commanded him, we pray for a similar measure of faith and devotion.

On the Feast of St Joseph and on the Annunciation of our Lord, we pray for a similar measure of faith and devotion. It kind of sounds like Lent. During this season, we are looking at the covenants we, as humans, have made with God throughout the centuries and how we have lived up to them and how we haven't lived up to them. We pray for an openness to live a life of faith like Mary and Joseph and the ability to hear and respond to God's call on our lives.

May these final weeks of Lent be one where we strive against evil and resist all that leads us away from God and neighbor. As on Ash Wednesday, we invite you to the discipline of Lent self-examination and repentance, prayers and fasting, sacrificial giving, and works of love all while being strengthened by the sacraments for this journey.

Let us continue our journey through Lent to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

Two books by Debbie Macomber have been given to DLC Library. *A Turn in the Road* features three women, Bethanne Hamlin who is in the middle of her life, her daughter, Annie, and her former mother-in-law, Ruth who are driving across the United States to Florida for Ruth's fiftieth high-school reunion. They mapped their trip before leaving, but other places seem to call out for them to explore, bringing other people into their lives. The second book, *Susannah's Garden*, features Susannah Nelson who at age fifty returns home to Colville, Washington when her mother, Vivian, a recent widow, is having difficulty coping and living alone. What she discovers is that things are not as they once seemed, but some gardens remain beautiful.

Child of Mine by David and Beverly Lewis tells about the kidnapping of baby Emily and her determined mother, Kelly Maines, who has spent eight years pursuing every lead her private investigator finds. One last clue ignites a tiny flame of hope.

Martin Marten by Brian Doyle is an interesting story about a pine marten, a small furry animal named Martin in this book, and his connection with Dave, a fourteen-year-old boy living with his family in a cabin on Oregon's Mount Hood, preferably called Wy'east by the Multnomah tribal peoples. The author has a knack of describing animals and their ways, the diverse people who live on the mountain, and his love for all of nature, including insects.

HEALTH MINISTRY

On the Horizon: Seasonal Allergies A Health Ministry Check Up By Krista Vanden Brink, RN



Spring is coming! The calendar even says so. People are getting the itch to rid themselves of cabin fever and enjoy some warmer sunshiny days. It also means the start of allergy season. Allergies are unusual, irritating, and potentially dangerous reactions of the immune system to a normally harmless substance. Symptoms usually include: sneezing; wheezing; nasal congestion; coughing; itchy, watery eyes; runny nose; itchy throat; stomach ache; itchy skin; hives; fatigue; and irritability. These reactions occur in about one out of every three people. They will attack the respiratory tract, digestive tract, or entire body, but the type and severity of the reaction will depend on the individual's level of sensitivity to the offending substance.

Virtually anything can cause an allergic reaction and since allergies can't be cured, it is important to determine and avoid the triggers for allergic reactions. Triggers can be environmental (ex. wind, pollen, poison ivy, pollution), chemical (ex. perfume, smoke, cleaning materials, latex rubber, medications), or foods (ex. shellfish, peanuts, wheat, milk, soy, strawberries, eggs). In addition, do not overlook items from the surroundings like animals, mold, bee stings, or dust.

People allergic to substances in the environment will experience more problems at specific times of the year. These are called seasonal allergies. Their symptoms will be worse during times of high winds when offending pollens are spread about. Late mornings or early afternoons have higher pollen counts which will cause more discomfort. The heavy air from high temperature and humidity will trigger an asthmatic's allergies. Different types of pollen (tree, grass, ragweed, flowers, etc.) are prevalent at different times of the year. For these reasons it is important to know what specific allergens trigger your symptoms and take an appropriate over-the-counter allergy relieving medication such as Claritin, Benadryl, or Zyrtec. One medication is not better than another and the generic brands work just as well as name brands. Find the one that works best for you with the other medications you take...and grab the tissues.
